



Ambulatory Emergency Care Network




- ASA 1 Normal healthy


Experience important

Relaxation of screening protocols


Move from screening to remove patients to the position

'How do I make this patient suitable for day surgery'










Performed as scheduled



- Danger if don't have senior staff
- Issues such as
 - Delays
 - Cancellations
 - Excess turnover times
 - Inappropriate anaesthesia techniques





Discharge



- This needs planning from outset
 - Agreed analgesia
 - who prescribes –usually anaesthetist?
 - analgesia packs
 - Agreed discharge criteria
 - Discharge information for patient carer
 - Important for all laparoscopic procedures
 - Telephone follow up

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
